



We asked some of The Great Buffalo Jewbilee! comittee members what they thought this upcoming Jewish extravaganza is all about. Here is what they said:



Buffalo Lions of Judah...the Story Continues



The Jewish Journal began profiling our Lions of Judah (LOJ) this spring. We wanted to tell the story of how Women's Philanthropy continues to play a vital role in our Campaign for Jewish Buffalo, and so we have been reaching out to our Buffalo Lions of Judah, asking them why giving at a LOJ is important to them, and why women giving in their own name matters. We are thankful and appreciative of all our donors. As you read on, you will learn about how three more extraordinary Lions make giving back to the Buffalo Jewish Community a high priority.



Julie Kianof Fink

Iulie Kianof Fink is Publisher and President Emeritus of Welcome Magazine, a hardcover book in all the hotel rooms in the Western New York area that is the premium guide to the Buffalo Niagara region. An artist and graphic designer by education and training with a BFA, she began working for Welcome Magazine in 1985, then took over as President of Welcome in 2001. She recently sold the company and going forward, she will be a consultant for advertising and marketing for a broad range of clients.

In the community, she is currently Vice President of the board of the Aquarium of Niagara Falls, and Vice Chair of Ladies 18-Hole Golfers at Park Country Club. A graduate of University at Buffalo's School of Management's Center for Entrepreneurial Leadership (CEL) Class of 2001, she is a past member of its board. She currently serves as Vice President/ Treasurer of Ahavas Shalom Cemetery in Niagara Falls."My family has been involved in this cemetery for many years; my grandparents and father are buried there. It was previously a shul, but now only the cemetery remains and we try to maintain it."

A member of Temple Beth Zion, and a past board member of the Buffalo Jewish Federation, she serves on The Campaign for Jewish Buffalo's Campaign Cabinet, and is a Co-Chair of its Lion of Judah Division. Julie and her husband, Raymond Fink, chaired the Federation's Community Kick-Off Dinner for two years. "Ray and I also discovered Kosher Meals on Wheels, and we have supported that," she said. Julie was also one of the more than 60 women who traveled to Israel with the Federation in December, 2008.

Julie Kianof Fink became a Lion of Judah in 2007, and got involved in the Jewish world when she started dating Ray Fink, whom she married in 2008. Her first project in the Jewish world was for the JCC-the "From Champagne to Chagall" Art Auction. "I wanted to do something relevant for the Jewish community, and I was unsure of what to do. This JCC auction opportunity came along, and I have always liked leadership roles," she said. "I also thought the women I knew from Federation who were Lions were already role models to me. I wanted to emulate them, so it seemed natural to become a LOJ, as well as get involved in the Campaign."

Julie was born in Niagara Falls, and had a small group of Jewish friends growing up there. Following her Bat Mitzvah at Temple Beth Israel, the family moved to Williamsville, and she explained that Jewish teen activities were not part of her life-- not camp or youth group.

"Maybe that's why I went full-force as a Lion and jumped right in as a volunteer. Being a Lion of Judah and a Jewish Federation volunteer really empowers me as a Jewish woman. I have a real pride about it. Becoming a Lion and my subsequent involvement in the community made me feel more Jewish, because I felt there had been a gap in my life. I wore my Lion pin at my niece's Bat Mitzvah in Boston recently, and several women I didn't know came up to talk to me. They were Lions of Judah, too, and they recognized the pin, and that we were all part of the same national Federations donor society. But being a Lion to me is not about the money. It is like a 'Sisterhood.' As a career woman, I can easily say that if other career women would consider becoming Lions of Judah, they would also find it equally rewarding." When asked whether or not she thinks women should make charitable gifts in their own name, she strongly said "yes." "I think women should make their own charitable gift to the community-they should give a separate gift, and be counted as part of the community. In making my own gift, I wanted to say that I am part of the Jewish People taking care of our own."

Julie concluded by saying that her gift is not about herself. "I think my gift is important beyond me. I don't have kids who will benefit from my philanthropy. I am giving because I feel like giving. Being a Lion feels good. It's a mitzvah because I'm doing good for others. It completes me emotionally," she said.



Marilyn Shine

Marilyn Shine is a woman who really cares about others. She worked professionally caring for people in need, and now she directs her philanthropy to those in need through the Campaign for Jewish Buffalo. The mother of Kevin, Paul and Rickey Jane and grandmother of four moved from Buffalo many years ago. She now resides in Boca Raton. But she and her family have not forgotten Jewish Buffalo. Her late husband, Jerry Shine was a Buffalo native and they raised their children here while running the family business, AIM Corrugated. Born in Brooklyn, Marilyn met Jerry Shine in Miami Beach, when they were both on vacation. They were introduced by a mutual friend, were married 4 months later, and then moved to Buffalo.

She went back to school when her youngest child was 10, and finished college. She then went to graduate school for an MSW, during which time (the early 1970's) Marilyn was an intern at Jewish Family Service of Buffalo & Erie County. "I really learned the needs of the Jewish Community during that time," she said. "I saw a great need that people are not always aware of," she said. Then she worked at Meyer Memorial Hospital which became ECMC, in the Dept. of Psychiatry. "I loved my job because I have always wished to help people."

Marilyn and Jerry retired, moved to Phoenix, then Florida. But they never lost their feeling for Western New York, something Marilyn has continued since the loss of her beloved Jerry. "The Jewish Community in Buffalo means a lot to me. Buffalo means a lot to me. Although we left Buffalo a while ago, unlike many of our friends, we felt that we made our money in Buffalo so we gave back to Buffalo. I never forget Buffalo."

She is a strong advocate for women making a difference and making a statement through their charitable gifts. "It is important that women give and are proactive in giving. I'm



a social worker, and I have been very involved in the lives of many different people," she said. "I worked at ECMC in Buffalo years ago, and I know what people who are in need are up against."

"When you need the most you have the least," she said, "and when you need the least you have the most. It is time for us to give back to Buffalo and help the community that made our lives great. When we were young, we benefit from the generosity of the community. Now I give back. It is something I am able to do and so I do."



Anne Viraa

Anne, a native of St. Catherines, Ontario now spends most of the year in Sarasota, Florida. She has held the position of regional President of AJC (American Jewish Committee) West Coast Florida for the past 6 years, and serves on its National Board of Governors. Anne is also on the board of Temple Emanu' El in Sarasota and on the board of Nate's Honor Animal Rescue in Sarasota. She is a resident of Florida, but makes her Federation gift here in Buffalo, like many other Buffalonians who winter away.

"I just returned from Israel- AJC'S Global Forum, celebrating Israel's 70th birthday," she said. "There were 2400 people there. We were able to meet with Members of the Knesset and Reuven Rivlin, the President of Israel. There were hundreds of young people including 400 college students, some from UB who attended through the generosity of the Benderson Family, who send at least 10 UB students to the AJC Global Forum every year."

"I was introduced to the world of philanthropy by my late life partner Nate Benderson, especially Jewish philanthropy. He inspired my giving. He knew I wanted to give, and said 'I want you to continue involvement after I am gone.' I became involved with AJC in Sarasota after Nate was honored with AIC's Human Relations Award. Nate believed in AJC, and he thought it would be an organization I would like to be involved in. I learned how important it is to support an organization whose causes and values I believe in. And giving to Federation as a Lion of Judah aligns with my values. The Lion of Judah through the Buffalo Jewish

Federation is a philanthropic Jewish national and international group of women. It shows the strength and leadership of women and that we care for all Iews and the future of Iews in North America and around the world."

"Why am I a Lion?" she asked, then answered. "It is an important organization which resonates with me, brings women of strength together, and, among other things, fights anti-Semitism in the US and globally. Through their gifts, Lions of Judah give back to their community, and those gifts reach around the world, which I like," she explained.

"I am proud to be Jewish. I am a Jewish woman by choice. I support the State of Israel and advocate for the rights of all people. For me, it is important to keep my commitment to Buffalo and keeping charitable funds here to support these needs. We cannot let our community suffer. We have to support Buffalo."

"I believe in interfaith dialogue. Anti-Semitism and extremism are on the rise in Europe, in the United States and around the world. That's why I believe our philanthropy is needed now more than ever during these difficult times. Winston Churchill said 'We make a living by what we get. We make a life by what we give.' The Lion of Judah group represents thousands of women around the world and it helps to make our voices heard. I love being a Lion of Judah," she exclaimed! "I love that giving at the Lion of Judah level (\$5,000+) helps to bring women locally together to work together for the Buffalo and worldwide Jewish community and it shows women's identity. I also think the pomegranate division is very important (\$1800-4999) for younger women in our communities. They are going to be the leaders of tomorrow and we need to encourage them to be givers and to bring more women like themselves into the community. Without these young people, our future hangs in the balance."

Anne is also generous in her opinions of other women in our community. "I admire women who give so much to this community-not just with philanthropybut with tireless work, and dedication to the Jewish communities. This is a defining moment for Jews around the world, and our LOJ gifts to our local campaigns funneled through JFNA can help. I am thrilled to be able to be a small part of an organization I believe in. I look forward to attending the LOJ International conference in January 2019 in Florida. I know it will be a huge success. I hope many other Buffalo Lions will join me there."



Jeremy Jacobs, Sr. to Receive **Benderson Award at Federation** Kick-Off Event 10/11

Buffalo community leader and philanthropist Jeremy ("Jerry") M. Jacobs, Sr. will receive the Buffalo Jewish Federation's prestigious Nathan Benderson Community Leadership Award at the Federation's Annual Campaign for Jewish Buffalo 2019 Kick-Off Community Event Thursday, October 11th at the Hyatt Regency Buffalo.

The Nathan Benderson Community Leadership Award is given to "the person whose extraordinary service and commitment to the Buffalo Jewish community exemplifies the leadership of Nathan Benderson." Buffalo Iewish Federation President Steven J. Weiss noted that Jacobs is an excellent choice for this year's award. "Like Nate Benderson, Jeremy Jacobs has created life-changing projects and orchestrated vital opportunities for the city and its people. The Jacobs Neurological Institute and UB's Jacobs School of Medicine and Biomedical Science are just two examples of his visionary philanthropy."

Jacobs is chairman of Delaware North, a global hospitality company with almost 55,000 employees serving half a billion customers annually in the United States, Canada, Asia, Australia, New Zealand and the United Kingdom. Delaware North's operations include food and retail at airports and sports venues, sports facility ownership and management, operations of parks and major tourist attractions, hotel ownership and management, gaming operations, and the Patina Restaurant Group.

Jacobs is also the owner of the Boston Bruins, and he serves as chairman of the National Hockey League's Board of Governors. In 2018 he received the sport's highest honor when he was inducted into the Hockey Hall of Fame.

Jacobs has served Western New York for more than four decades with his business

expertise and philanthropic leadership, and Delaware North has received multiple awards for social responsibility, community service and environmental stewardship.

Jordan Levy, a 2012 Benderson Award Winner said "Jeremy Jacobs is this year's honoree because of his selfless philanthropy to the Jewish community for the last 50 years. He has always been there, doesn't ask for recognition for himself or his family, and always says 'yes'. He has been supportive of the Jewish Federation Campaign, Temple Beth Zion, and the Foundation for Jewish Philanthropies for many, many decades."

Jordan Levy also noted the extraordinary nature of the Jacobs Family's loyalty and generosity to the Buffalo community as a whole. "The Family's devotion to Buffalo and this community is unprecedented. All of us work towards emulating the example Jeremy has set."

Jacobs' father, Louis Jacobs, a son of Jewish immigrants from Poland, founded a company in Buffalo in 1915 with his two brothers that first sold concessions in theaters and then expanded to major league ballparks. Louis Jacobs took over the company in 1950, changed it to Sportservice, and Jeremy took over in 1968 on Louis' death.

An alumnus of the University at Buffalo

School of Management and the Harvard Business School's Advanced Management Program, Jacobs is Chairman of the University at Buffalo Council. He was appointed to the UB Council in 1997, and in 1998 Governor George E. Pataki named him as Chair. A longtime friend and supporter of UB, Iacobs also has served as chairman of the President's Board of Visitors and adviser to the School of Management. Jacobs holds honorary doctorates in humane letters from UB. Canisius College, Niagara University and Johnson & Wales University. In 2015, his family donated \$30 million to advance UB's medical school, which has been renamed the Jacobs School of Medicine and Biomedical Sciences.


Dr. Elad I. Levy is, among other titles, Professor and Chair of the Department of Neurosurgery at the Jacobs School of Medicine and Biomedical Sciences. He has experienced first-hand Jacobs' commitment to excellence in Buffalo. "Jeremy Jacobs' compassion and commitment to medical innovation and excellence catalyzed the creation of the world-class Jacobs Institute," Levy

said. "At this Institute, he has provided a home for physicians, scientists and engineers to come together to create the next generation of neuroscience technologies."

Jacobs and his wife, Peggy, live in East Aurora. They have six children, eighteen grandchildren, and three great-grandchildren.

Visitors to the Jewbilee! will be able to watch a recording of an outstanding Buffalo Theater trio at the JCC. WAY BACK WHEN, a trio of cheeky one act plays with their roots in The Book of Genesis, was assembled as a complete evening by Grant Golden, and accepted as a part of the New Phoenix Theatre's 2017-18 season about a year ago. Two of the plays, THE CREATION and WAY BACK WHEN, were written by Golden. The other, IN THE BEGINNING, was the brainchild of the late Rebecca Ritchie, a dear friend of Golden and his wife. The program kicks off, appropriately enough, with THE CREATION. G-d has just created a new planet for an old solar system of His, and is ready for a nap. Mrs. G-d, none too impressed with this creation, cajoles Him into an ever more complicated series of "improvements" (a number of which end up not at all to her liking!) over the next six

"days." After a good deal of lively debate and some compromise, G-d at length gets his nap (read: Shabbat).


IN THE BEGINNING, set in an "alt" modern time, concerns the surprise first meeting of Eve and Lilith, now old women. Adam, not long deceased, is being honored for his contributions with a statue and a documentary. Eve, who has been spouting the company line for a good long time, is content to play second fiddle, but the probing, feisty Lilith thinks it's time to upset the apple cart...

WAY BACK WHEN retells the famous Binding of Isaac story, with G-d taking heat from Mrs. G-d on the concept, and Abraham cooking up a desperate scheme to save his little son. No spoilers. True "alt" theology, with a very touching ending!

An original ballad, "Ages Ago" (God's love song to Mrs. G-d) was composed by Golden specifically for this production. WAY BACK WHEN completed a successful four week run at the New Phoenix in February. It was later nominated for an Artie award for Best Original Production of 2017-18. The handsome twocamera video is from Select Sound. The show is approximately 90 minutes in length. It will be screened during the Jewbilee at the JCC at 12:30, 2:30 and 4:30 pm. Cantor's Column: Oy Vey....a 5 K

We know all too well that our Torah is chock full of stories, insights, rules, obligations, laws, precepts. It can seem like an endless tzimmes! And really, who doesn't enjoy a good tzimmes? Many times, what we read in Torah can seem confusing, obscure, often foreign as we continue to live in modern times. When we desperately yearn for a connection with our sacred text, we seek to glean meaning not only in Torah but also from the space that lies in between the letters of our Torah. One need not search far to find a way to relate Torah to our modern lives. Even as we dwell in the diaspora, our sages created the blueprint for us to follow which is relevant.

With this recognition, our texts instruct us on how we can live authentically to serve

Hashem and each other. We are taught to take care of our communities, each other and even our bodies. The joys and challenges of marriage were celebrated recently when ten couples were honored at a marriage reconsecration ceremony during a Shabbat service at Congregation Shir Shalom. The couples, married for anywhere from 20 to 62 years, stood under a chuppah and were urged by Rabbi Alex Lazarus-Klein to reflect on their time together -- their happiness, their fears, their children, their communities.

"Take a moment to look at each other," he said. "I want you to remember the first time you met. Think of all you have lived together. Think of everything you were able to overcome together. Feel the blessing of that journey."

The 30-year journey of Jill and Phil Hamilton developed after Jill, then a graduate student, chatted regularly with Phil, who worked at a convenience store Jill stopped at between classes. Jill thought Phil was simply being nice to her as a customer until he asked her out. Last month, they were together on the Bimah,



celebrating three decades of marriage. "I was just thinking that it was our 30th anniversary, and it would be nice to do this," said Jill, a psychologist and a past president of Shir Shalom. "Thirty years is a long time as you look back."

The reconsecration service was introduced at the synagogue about ten years ago at the suggestion of Rella Corris, a longtime active member of Shir Shalom, who learned of it in California. "To be in a loving relationship takes work,"



said Rabbi Lazarus-Klein. "This is our way of celebrating the accomplishments of couples in our community. They deserve a place to publicly reaffirm their love and commitment to one another." Phil Hamilton, who usually gets together

with friends while Jill attends Shabbat services on Friday evenings, showed that commitment in a very concrete way. When Jill asked him to skip his social outing to attend services, he replied: "As long as I'm with you."





P2G: Buffalo & The Western Galilee

This June, Susan Goldberg Schwartz represented the Buffalo Jewish Federation at the annual Partnership2Gether (P2G) Summit, held in Israel in the Western Galilee. The Western Galilee P2G connects the U.S. Central Area Consortium consisting of 14 U.S. Jewish Federation communities (Buffalo is the newest community to join the consortium), Budapest, Hungary and Israel's Western Galilee.

In addition to meeting the staff and many volunteers of the Western Galilee P2G, the Summit participants visited local villages and communities (kibbutzim and moshavim) and organizations in the partnership region. Highlights of the trip included a visit to the Akko Naval Academy, volunteering in a local food pantry and visiting a Druze village, whose school has received funding from Buffalo, bringing Druze and Jewish kindergartners together over the

In July, Esti and Ori Waismen, two of the Learn2Gether participants from Israel, came to visit their chevruta (study partners) Joan and David Alexander. The Alexanders hosted a lovely evening for the visiting Israelis and were joined by Susan Goldberg Schwartz, and Helen and Bernie Weinstein. Through all of these experiences and more, I have learned so much about myself and the connection I







Separating Children and Parents Results in Long-term Trauma for All

Anyone who has witnessed the meltdown of a child separated from his or her parents under the best of circumstance can understand the anguish it causes. Imagining the pain and anxiety of children and parents unceremoniously separated after having experienced the trauma of refugee flight is nearly impossible. From a humanitarian standpoint all of the evidence points to children who are forcibly separated and kept apart from their parents experiencing perhaps irreversible trauma.

The removal of children from caregivers places children at risk for ongoing anxiety, depression, separation anxiety and PTSD as they get older, according to Donna Possenti, VP of Clinical and Behavioral Operations here at Jewish Family Service of Buffalo & Erie County (JFS). Children who are detained -- such as those currently separated from parents seeking asylum at the U.S.-Mexico border -- typically have had a history of traumatic experiences. They are at an even higher risk for a variety of psychosocial and developmental problems linked to their detention experience, Possenti advises. Among other symptoms, such problems may appear as aggression, withdrawal and change in eating habits.

At JFS we see the results of trauma on a regular basis. As a result we understand that it's certainly in the best interest to do as little as possible to disrupt the parent-child relationship. We advocate that this is in the best interest of all in order to help maintain the mental health of young children, parents and caregivers.

Jewish Family Service of Buffalo & Erie County has a long history of helping people experiencing issues related to trauma. During the 1970s we took the regional lead in the resettlement of Jews fleeing Russia. Today, we remain dedicated to ensuring our community's Holocaust survivors spend their older adult years living in safe, positive and healthy environments.

We were founded more than 150 years ago on the tenets of our Jewish faith to serve and support Jewish families living in Buffalo and Western New York. This support now extends to offer a lifeline of new hope to all individuals and families living in our service area, regardless of religious belief, ethnicity, gender identity, political affiliation or economic status. Our vision is informed in part by Jewish history - by firsthand experience as a stranger seeking refuge in a new land.

As the social service safety net for the Buffalo Jewish community, we understand well that while inhumanity may come in many forms, every form of inhumanity must be loudly and actively denounced.

Our core belief, in the words of Holocaust Survivor and Nobel Laureate Elie Wiesel, is that all human beings are entitled to live with dignity and respect, without fear or pain. Along with our Jewish practices of tikkun olam and tzedakah, this is the foundation of our organizational culture: We

hold unequivocally that inhumane treatment of even one person diminishes the humanity of us all.

This is why we urge each of you to take a conscious stand here at home against the use of parentchild separation and detainment that compromises the safety and well-being of migrant families. In retrospect of and respect for our own Jewish Experience, both abroad and here in the U.S., we must morally and legally challenge Department of Justice/ Department of Homeland Security policy that results in long-term trauma for all parties, voluntary and involuntary, who are part of inhumane practice.

Our resettlement partner HIAS (Hebrew Immigration Aid Society) offers many ways to do this at www. hias.org: You are invited to join the "Jews for Refugees" Facebook group (#jewsforrefugees), write a Letter to the Editor or Op-Ed and submit it to the local news, or print "Refugees Welcome" signs to display at your home, office or svnagogue.

HIAS also encourages local congregations to join the HIAS Welcome Campaign, a network of nearly 400 synagogues taking action for refugees through advocacy, direct service. community education tzedakah. Among other actions, the Network of Jewish Human Service Agencies (NJHSA) calls for reaching out with messages of protest to the American **Immigration Lawyers Association** (AILA), which can direct calls, tweets, Facebook posts and emails to all Members of Congress.
