Have well-developed Jewish resumes with many Jewish organizational experiences.	Have shorter Jewish resumes with fewer Jewish organizational experiences.
Have enough Jewish knowledge to feel comfortable in most Jewish settings.	Fear that they don't have enough Jewish knowledge to feel comfortable and authentic.
Connect with organizations because they want specific types of experiences.	Connect with organizations because they need a particular service, like a religious school for their children.
