PURPOSE

To help fulfill our mission of providing for the quality and continuity of Jewish Life in Western New York and around the world, the Foundation for Jewish Philanthropies encourages participation in programs of study and travel to Israel by providing financial assistance as needed.

ELIGIBILITY

These Israel Scholarship funds make grants annually to worthy Jewish high school and college aged students of Western New York who plan to participate in organized programs in Israel, such as synagogue youth tours, work study programs, kibbutz programs, high school abroad, and leadership development missions. To apply, an applicant must complete and submit the following:

- Scholarship Application
- Personal Statement
- References
- Financial Statements

CRITERIA

Scholarship awards will be based upon the following:

- Financial need
- Demonstrated Jewish commitment
- Participation in academic or extracurricular activities

COMMITTEE REVIEW

All applications are reviewed by a volunteer committee composed of community representatives appointed by the Foundation. The committee meets once a year, in early Winter, to make determinations.
